

The barns were moved and rebuilt at Moors Valley Country Park and Forest.






You can sit and eat a picnic at Moors Valley Country Park and Forest.

Moors Lake has fish called Dace, Rudd, Perch and Pike.




Mammals like water voles and otters live around Moors Lake.
